Disciplinary knowledge: Cause and Consequence

Year1	<u>Transport and travel</u> Know that transport has changed so that it can be safer, faster and cheaper
Year2	<u>The Great Fire of London</u> identify the reasons why the fire spread so quickly and understand the damage that the fire caused. <u>Kings and Queens</u> consider the impact the Magna Carta had on King John's power and understand that battles for power led to a fairer government
Year3	<u>Ancient Egypt</u> Understand how the union of upper and lower Egypt established Ancient Egypt's first dynasty and understand how the beliefs about the afterlife led to the use of mummification
Year4	<u>The Romans</u> Identify why the Romans invaded Britain and the outcome of Julius Caesar's invasion. Understand why the Roman army was successful in expanding the Roman empire Identify the causes in the decline of Roman rule in Britain <u>Roman Britain</u> Understand the impact brought by the changes in settlement types
Year5	<u>Anglo-Saxons and Scots</u> Understand why the laws, customs and language was affected after the Romans left Britain Understand how Anglo-Saxons converting to Christianity changed England <u>Vikings</u> Understand why the Danelaw was created Know the events that led to Vikings becoming kings of England <u>Baghdad and the Middle East</u> Know why Baghdad was built Identify what caused Baghdad to become a centre of learning Understand the causes and consequences of the decline of the Golden Age of Islam
Year6	<u>Ancient Greeks</u> Identify people and events that enabled Ancient Greece to flourish <u>Conflict and resolution</u> Understand the causes of WWI Understand the impact of the trenches on the lives of soldiers Know what caused the end of WWI and what happened afterwards Identify how the events of 1930s led to WWII Understand the impact of WWII on Britain and the Home Front Understand the consequences of War on settlement in the UK and how this led to the rebuilding of Britain
