EFYS	Children learn that people believe different things. Children look at a series of festivals and celebrations including Ramadan.
Year1	<u>What do Muslims celebrate?</u> Know that Islam is a religion and the followers are called Muslim Know that Islam was founded by the Prophet Muhammad Know that some Muslims fast and think about people that are important in their religion and show self-control Learn that some Muslims mark Mawlid al-Nabi which is the birthday of Muhammad but some Muslims choose not to Know that Eid al-Fitr happens at the end of Ramadan Know that some people go to Mecca on a pilgrimage and this is called Hajj

Year3	<u>Islamic rites of passage</u> Discuss the 5 pillars of Islam Know that Islam is a religion as a whole and Muslim refers to an individual Explore naming ceremonies and what names symbolise Learn about the four steps of marriage for Muslim people Discuss what the after-life means for Muslims and the reasons for funerals Understand the importance of Hajj for Muslims

Year5	<u>Why is Muhammad important to Muslims?</u>
Year6	Know about the life of Muhammad and why he is an important figure for Muslims Know that Muhammad's revelations from the angel Gabriel formed the Islamic holy book- the Qur'an Understand what happened to Muhammad after the first revelation in the cave Know how the Qur'an is respected and treated by Muslims Understand that the Qur'an is God's final revelation to the world and that Muhammad was the final prophet in a long line of prophets Know that the Hadith is a record of Muhammad's teachings and morals Understand that Muhammad is a role model for Muslims
